


EASTER - THE FEAST OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

"They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid Him." Twice Mary Magdalene repeats these words of desolation. Twice she expresses the loss of love, loyalty and hope. Then a third time, even when she meets her Lord, her desolation is so great that she cannot recognize him. Are Mary's words of lose not our words many days in our lives? Have we not all felt a loss so deep that we felt we were beyond all consolation? Listen to the passage carefully. Jesus dries Mary's inconsolable tears by just calling her name "Mary"!

Easter is the day when Jesus calls each one of us by name and shows us that we are not beyond hope or consolation. The resurrection addresses our losses and our hope. The joyous celebration of Easter reminds us that no place of despair is beyond Christ's redeeming presence. This is important for us to hear in a time like ours when it is so easy to lose hope in everything. The Easter liturgy is our personal invitation to hear Jesus call our name like He called Mary's name. Look to the end of the reading for Mary's response. She went to tell everyone what she had heard. Let us become the people who add our voices to Mary's to tell the world what we have heard.



EASTER SUNDAY

Imagine, if you will, someone coming to you and saying, "I have something to share with you, something too wonderful to hold back, something that, quite possibly, you will not believe. You may even want to kill me after I say it. I know this, and yet I must speak." Peter, in today's first reading, is driven to bear witness to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, even though he knows that he will be rejected and suffer for it. When we hear about Peter, filled with the Spirit and with Easter joy, proclaiming the Good News, we hear what we, the baptized, must do as well. In the reading from Colossians, St. Paul reminds us that resurrection is not just a solitary event, but a continuing part of our lives. Because of our baptism, we live anew and are raised with Christ in glory.

WITNESS AND EXPERIENCE

John's Gospel captures the flavour of the Easter morning experience. Picture Mary coming to the tomb in the dark. Feel her confusion, her fear as she discovers that the tomb is empty. Nothing in her life could have prepared her for this moment. Yes, Jesus had told them that he would rise again, but how could they have understood? She run to Peter, heart pounding, tears flowing. Peter and the beloved disciples dash to the tomb, confused and fearful as well. It is Peter who goes in first: Peter, the rock of the church of Christ. He holds the burial cloths in his hands. They stand in the empty tomb, silent. They don't understand yet, but they know that life has changed in a way that they had not thought possible. Their heads swim in confusion, but their hearts burn with the fire of the Spirit. Can it be true? Has Jesus indeed risen?

We, too, have stood with Mary, Peter, and all the disciples in the empty tomb, filled with fear and foreboding, yet also with Spiritenflamed hearts pounding. The power of Easter joy can temper our fears and take us from the tomb out into the world, where we must spread the Good News: **Christ is risen!**

REQUEST FOR MASS INTENTIONS

When requesting Mass Intentions at the parish office, there are two types:

<u>Announced Mass</u> – a date is chosen due to availability and the name of the individual for whom the Mass is being said, along with the name of the person/family requesting the Mass is posted in the bulletin during the week of requested Mass. (Donation \$20)

<u>Unannounced Mass</u> – there is no specific date given for when this Mass would be celebrated and the intention does not appear in the bulletin. (Donation \$10)

It is important to note that when requesting any <u>Announced Mass</u>, it is recommended that you contact the parish office as early as possible, as sometimes we have Masses scheduled two months in advance. For both kinds of requests, Mass cards are provided at the office for those making arrangements for these special Masses.
