

THOUGHTS FOR SOWING

THE ADVENT JOURNEY - WITH NEW EYES!

I routinely take the same short drive to my office. I am so used to seeing the houses or apartments, the stop signs and traffic lights, that I am often not really paying attention. But every day something new is happening on that brief drive.

I share the way with a myriad and diverse group of travelers as well as activities. People walk hand in hand, joggers run, children jump rope, bicyclists pedal, wheelchairs move. Trees constantly change, snow piles up, icicles drip from roofs, rain water pours over the curb, buds bloom. Every day is different.

When we travel on familiar paths and roadways, there are things on the way that are seemingly hidden from us. We are so used to the routine that we sometimes cannot see what might be on the path directly in front of us.

Yet in the ordinary is found the extraordinary. I simply need to open my ears, my eyes, my senses. I need to be wide awake!

How many times have we traveled the Advent pathway? Every year we hear similar reminders; every three years we hear these same readings, this year from Matthew's Gospel. They are so familiar that we might not hear the nuances or the word that might jump at us if we gave over our full attention. Like changing a radio frequency or fine tuning a musical instrument for the clearest sound, we must fine tune our senses as we pray and sing, listen and respond to the richness of this Advent/Christmas season.

What must we do to awaken for this journey once again?

Look east! Look to unusual travelers, signs, and stars! Look to the least, the insignificant, the discounted! Look at the ways people choose to be faithful. Look to those who seek and follow Emmanuel. Look on the familiar path you follow every day. Look to those who journey side by side with you.

Yes, let us be wide awake this Advent! Recognize in our human daily encounters the advent of God. The Incarnation all over again. See – look deeply – for in the face of any and all, we meet the Christ. The face of God.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK IT'S ADVENT ALREADY!

You might notice something different about our Advent Wreath in the Sanctuary. For years the Advent Season was looked upon as a "<u>Mini Lent</u>" with a penitential spirit, along with the purple representing the "penance" of the Lenten Season. In the midst of this "Penitential Season" of four weeks, there was one week to "rejoice" so there was a rose or "lighter colour" used to designate the third week.

Advent is now seen as <u>not</u> a "Penitential Season" but one continuous <u>Season of four weeks</u> waiting in expectation for the coming of the Messiah. Although we still use the colour purple it possesses a different meaning than "penance". Rather it is looked upon as the "<u>Royal Purple</u>" representing the Kingly aspect of Christ whose birth was longed for by the Israelites for 1,000's of years. Thus we have all four purple candles on the Advent Wreath indicating one season of hope and expectation that lasts four weeks. Needless to say, you may organize your Advent candles with either arrangement – all four purple or three purple and one rose. What is important to remember is that the Advent Wreath is the ancient symbol of our connection to the Israelite's years of waiting for the birth of Christ the Messiah and now our present time of waiting, full of expectation and hope for the <u>Second Coming</u> of the Risen Lord as the **King of the Universe**.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO YOUR PARISH

If you are unable to attend in person, you are no doubt aware that our parish relies on the support of our parishioners to operate – salaries, programs and ongoing operating costs (heating, water, electricity, etc.). These are funded through the generosity of our parish community.

It continues to be a challenge for our parish to maintain operations without the weekly offertory collection. We have benefited greatly from the Canada Employment Wage subsidy, but that support has almost disappeared.

Here are the ways that you can continue to support our parish at this time:

- Mail your regular weekly offertory contribution to the parish or drop off to the parish mailbox by the lower right side of the office door.
- Online donations can be made through our <u>website</u> click on Donate icon and follow the instructions. This can be done as a one-time donation or as an ongoing monthly donation.
- **Contribute through Pre-Authorized Giving**. You can obtain a form from the parish office or request to e-mail it to you. Mail or drop off the completed form and a voided cheque to the parish office. Or e-mail the form and a scanned copy or photo of a voided cheque to <u>development@archtoronto.org</u> for processing. Contributions are withdrawn from your bank account on the 20th of each month. This amount will then be deposited to the parish's account.
- You can contribute to the offertory via on-line banking similar to how you may be paying your utility bills. To do this, they need to send you your unique account number. Please email <u>campaign@archtoronto.org</u>. In the body of the email provide them with your name, address, parish name and municipality. They will email you your account information which you can use to set up the Archdiocese of Toronto as a payee in your on-line banking. Your gift will be forwarded to St. Margaret's parish. You can make a one-time or recurring gift to your offertory. This is the most cost effective way to donate electronically.
