

#### FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION – DEC. 8<sup>TH</sup>

The feast of the Immaculate Conception does not celebrate the conception of Jesus. It celebrates the belief that his mother was conceived free from sin. We tell the story of the Annunciation on this feast because this is the reason Mary was so favored by God.

Jesus came to show us what God looks like. Jesus is God with skin on. But it is Mary who gave him that skin. Mary shows us what we are all called to be. We are all called to enflesh the divine in our own lives, to make God visible by the way we live. Francis of Assisi once said that we are the only image of God some people will ever know. What God are we modeling for them?

Mary was blameless in God's eyes from the moment of her conception, for a very special reason. But it is also true, as Paul tells us today, that we were chosen, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and blameless. It would be an overwhelming task if the angel Gabriel had not told Mary how we can all accomplish it. The Holy Spirit will come upon us, and the power of the Most High overshadow us.

Immaculate Conception is an invitation to all of us to allow the power of the Holy Spirit to become a reality in our lives.

#### **Practice**

Today, be particularly conscious of the fact that you are making God visible for others. Ask the Holy Spirit for the insight to know how God would respond in each difficult situation you encounter.

#### THE CHURCH

WHAT DID THAT SPIRIT give the newborn community of eleven apostles? The traitor was no longer there, but he would soon be replaced by another, and still others would succeed the apostles, and these would eventually become this community of ours which today fills the cathedral and is listening to us through the radio. We are the community that, by the promise and breath of Christ the church was born, as Christ himself explained, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21-22). The mission that the church carries out in the world for all ages is none other than the mission of Christ dead and risen. The church celebrates her liturgy and preaches her word for that reason alone: to save people from sin, to save them from enslavements, to overthrow idolatries, and to proclaim the one God who loves us. This will always be the difficult task of the church, and she realizes that she must never betray his message. Since carrying out this mission cost Christ humiliation and the cross, the church also must be ready if necessary to suffer martyrdom, the cross, humiliation and persecution, as Christ did.
