

THE MOVEMENT OF PRAYER

Gentle Savior, thank you for the good night's rest I enjoyed. Strengthen me now to do your will in all things, so that at the end of the day I can say that I have done my best. *Amen*.

Jesus, even in the freshness of morning, it is all too easy to take another day for granted. Help me to savor this moment and to cherish the gift of life, even in difficult times. I know that your promises are the only guarantees life holds for us. So help me to appreciate what I have, especially the people you have put in my life. May I never lose sight of how precious my time with them really is. *Amen*.

THIS LENT...

Special is good word for describing Lent. Lent calls us to take more seriously and make special just forty days of our lives. Each of these forty days is a gift and another opportunity to connect with the source of our lives: **God**. Forty special days! Let's not waste so many other days.

If we take each of these forty days one at a time with the Church, we will see unravel before our eyes the great Mystery of Salvation. It is Christ who calls us to look with more attention and love as he hangs on the Cross for us and as he rises from the tomb. We will grow in the realization that he is the greatest person in the history of the world.

All of the suggestions and ideas which have grown up around Lent are summarized in three words: prayer, conversion and works of charity. These are days for doing a little more of each of the three.

Prayer: we should spend a little more time in raising our minds and hearts to God, especially in meditation of the life of Christ as found in the holy Gospel; holy mass, and the stations of the Cross are a good help in doing this, also the recitation of the holy Rosary and meditation on the mysteries.

Conversion: we achieve conversion little by little. It takes effort and self-denial to bring ourselves round to living our lives more and more for God. Fasting one day a week, or giving up candy or cake are just some examples. The reason for giving up what is permitted seems to lie in the fact that they serve: to curb our self-centeredness, over-all "grabbingness" and self-indulgence.

Works of Charity: Under conversion, we usually speak of the negative practices of Lent, but under the works of charity we refer to the positive things that we can do for God and our neighbour.

Whatever we do for Lent, let us realize that it brings us closer and closer each day to the Paschal mystery. We are given these forty days of preparation so that we will reach Easter Sunday prepared mentally and spiritually and emotionally to look upon the greatness of the **Gift of God**.
