

THOUGHTS FOR SOWING

STONE-FACED

I have set my face like flint... Isaiah 50:7

Do you ever think about the immense courage of Jesus? Having a true human nature (Hebrews 2:5-18), his inner strength is remarkable, particularly during the last week of his life on earth. Jesus' courage has many of the characteristics of the "suffering servant" in the Book of Isaiah. Today, his inner strength is compared to that of flint, an extremely hard stone. Jesus knew what he was facing in those final days. He could easily have slipped through the crowds as he had done previously when in life-threatening danger and escaped the humility and torture of being on the cross. But this time, he deliberately goes toward his death with profound bravery, aiving himself trustingly into the arms of his Abba. We can learn from the courage of Jesus and draw on our inner resiliency when in need. We can also place ourselves in the Holy One's care. With God's grace, we, too, can "set our face like flint" when facing daunting circumstances.

ORAT is Canada's largest private Sponsorship Agreement Holder, which helps bring hundreds of newcomers to our country each year; it will use donations to bring Ukrainian refugees to Canada as soon as possible.

The law of abstinence forbids the eating of meat; the law of fasting allows one full meal a day but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning or evening, observing common sense.

The law of abstinence from meat binds those who are 14 years and older.

The law of fasting binds those from 18-59 of age.

GOOD FRIDAY PONTIFICAL COLLECTION

The Pontifical collection for the benefit of the Holy Places is scheduled this year on **Good Friday, April 15th**. Our parish, once a year on Good Friday, is called to support Christians in the Holy Land. Many Christians in the Holy Land depend on the collection for their lives.

As Pontifical collection requested by Pope Francis, the annual Good Friday collection helps to maintain not only the holy Places above all, but also the pastoral, welfare, educational and social works that the Church carries out to the benefit of the

THE CROSS OF CHRIST

Today marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most important and solemn week of the Church's liturgical calendar. In the Gospel this Sunday we are invited to reflect on the passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. The cross is the most recognizable symbol of our Christian faith. We see crucifixes hanging in Churches, schools, homes and even worn around many people's necks. However, we can become so used to this constant presence of the crucifix that we become indifferent to what it signifies. Let us take a moment to grasp the beauty and truth found in the cross.

God became man and was willing to be crucified for the forgiveness of our sins. It is through the cross that Christ defeats Satan and triumphantly attains our salvation, allowing us to enter our heavenly home. The entire course of human history was dramatically altered because of the cross of Christ. As stewards, we should always view the salvation won through the cross as the greatest gift that God has bestowed on us.

As we approach the Holy Triduum, let us take some time each day this week to reflect on the passion of Christ. Many great saints strongly promoted this practice of calling to mind the sufferings of Christ. We can do this in many ways such as praying the Stations of the Cross or the sorrowful mysteries of the Rosary, reading the passion narratives in the Bible or simply gazing upon the crucifix. Let us never fail to appreciate the sublime beauty of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross.


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
